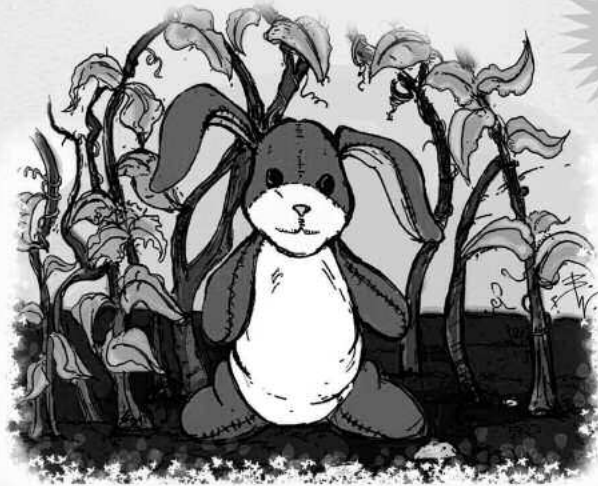

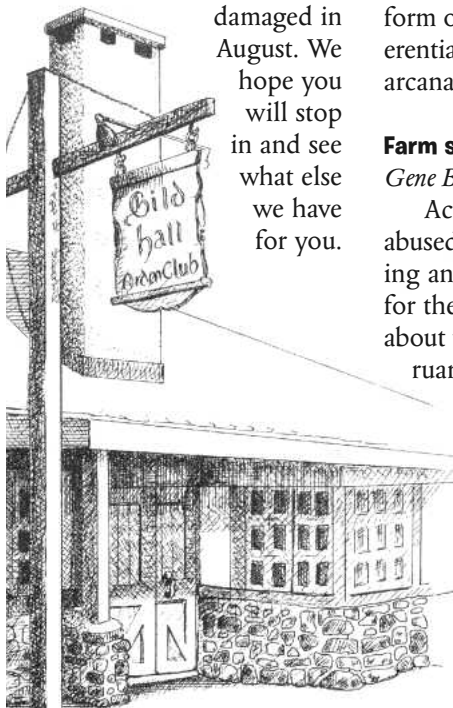

Here are excerpts of reviews for some new books the library acquired to replace those that were damaged in August. We hope you will stop in and see what else we have for you.



**The atlas of food: who eats what, where, and why** by Erik Millstone and Tim Lang

Concerns about both the environment and globalization have prompted an interest in how food is produced, processed, packaged, and transported, as well as how it is prepared and eaten. Distilling a great deal of information into an attractive package, the atlas offers a good introduction to the global food system. *Booklist* (March 1, 2009 (Online))

**Banana: the fate of the fruit that changed the world** by Dan Koeppl

Taken for granted as a supermarket staple and praised as an especially healthy food, the banana reigns as one of the world's most popular edibles. Koeppl traces banana history, explaining how the worldwide banana market rests on a long history of rapacious, repressive, and predatory agricultural-industrial practices. These have so dominated the countries nurturing this crop that they have spawned their own unique form of government: the banana republic. Despite a chatty and self-referential style, Koeppl conveys a fascinating and useful wealth of banana arcana. *Booklist* (December 15, 2007 (Vol. 104, No. 8))

**Farm sanctuary: changing hearts and minds about animals and food** by Gene Baur

Activist Baur, who cofounded Farm Sanctuary in 1986 to rescue abused farm animals, has written a stunning indictment of factory farming and the way most Americans obtain their food. Baur's report is not for the faint of heart, but it is critical reading for anyone willing to ask about the origin of their food. A life-altering read. *Booklist* starred (February 1, 2008 (Vol. 104, No. 11))

**Kitchen literacy: how we lost knowledge of where food comes from and why we need to get it back** by Ann Vileisis

Today's Americans know virtually nothing about where their food comes from, contends Vileisis, and she fears that such ignorance disrupts vital historical connections between producers and consumers to the detriment of both. She documents how this state of affairs arose in the past few decades as America shifted from an agrarian to an urban society. *Booklist* (October 1, 2007 (Vol. 104, No. 3))

Did you see Luke Bulla sing that great Works Progress Administration (WPA) song at the October 9 Jerry Douglas concert? WPA stands out by virtue of its sophisticated, complex melodies and dense, almost organic arrangements.

WPA consists of some of the most accomplished and legendary musicians in today's American music scene. Founding members Glen Phillips (Toad the Wet Sprocket), Sean Watkins (Nickel Creek), and Luke Bulla (Jerry Douglas Band, Ricky Skaggs, Lyle Lovett) have teamed up with long-time acclaimed producer Jim Scott (Wilco, Tom Petty and the Heartbreakers, Rolling Stones). Once they entered Scott's studio, the group was able to collaborate and record the entire album plus a number of bonus tracks in only five days.

WPA was born out of the musical community surrounding the legendary LA club, Largo. The full band is an octet, but the core trio will appear in Arden with two supporting players.

# Young Actors Workshop

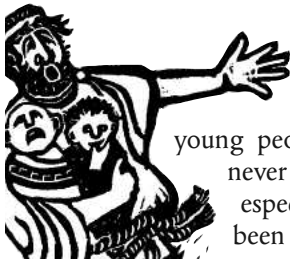

The Arden Shakespeare Gild presents its 12th (!) annual Young Actors Workshop on six Saturday afternoons starting January 9. This is a Shakespeare scene workshop directed by members of the gild for kids from age 6 through high school. Actors are assigned to a director and rehearsals are scheduled for 1-2 hours between 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. **(Please note the earlier hours this year.)** Our aim is to have a small number of actors in each scene so everyone gets a good opportunity to speak and act. We do not “dumb down” the text in any way, although some directors can be relied on to “silly things up”.

On Sunday, Feb. 14, the public is invited to attend the showcase of scenes in the Upper Hall.

The Young Actors Workshop is a unique opportunity for kids to speak the speeches actors have been performing for over 400 years – and for good reason – because it's the greatest material ever: filled with passion, humor, great insults, beautiful poetry, wit, anger, fear, goofiness and alliteration.



Each year the Young Actors Workshop attracts over 50 young people. Even if you have never been on stage before – especially if you have never been on stage before – join us.

## Important New Registration Info

Registration for the workshop will be held from noon to 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, Dec. 5, in the Bratten Room of the lower Gild Hall. There will be no group “auditions” this year, but children will have an opportunity to meet and speak with the directors. Registration forms are available online at ardenclub.org and it will simplify registration a lot if you fill them out ahead of time.

### Parents must be present at registration.

This is because we have important things to communicate with the parents. PLEASE BRING YOUR APPOINTMENT CALENDARS. You must fill out a list of rehearsal conflicts so we can schedule rehearsals and assign actors to scenes according to when actors are available.

**Cost for the workshop is \$30, and \$50 maximum per family.** Full and partial scholarships are available upon request. Payment is due at Registration. There will also be a DVD of the showcase, which you can order for \$20. All workshop participants must be current members of the Arden Club. If you are not already a member, you can join the Club at registration. A form is on page 11. If you are paying by check, you will need to pay with a separate check for Club membership.

In the middle of winter, we will spend some time reviewing our past gardening successes and challenges, and we will share our ideas and gardening plans for the New Year.

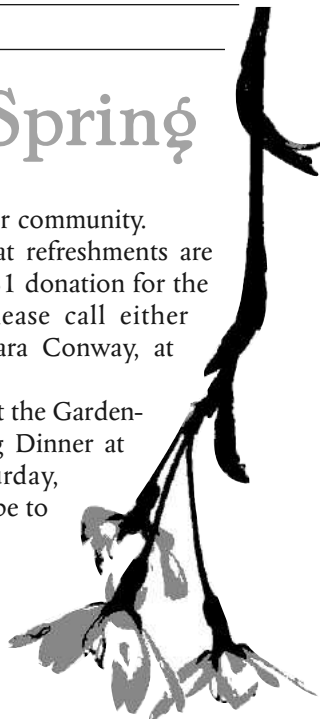
